DARLOT - Later known as - WOODARRA.

DAVYHURST - Earlier known as - DAVYSTON - and - MACE'S FIND.

LOCATION = Latitude 30° 03' south by Longitude 120° 39' east. South west of the current town of Menzies. 1

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HISTORY = The Waihi mine was discovered by "Watty" DAVYS in November 1899. Other nearby mines were the Golden Pole, the Great Ophir and the Callion. When it was proposed to declare a townsite there in 1900 the site was referred to as Dayyston. better known as Mace's Find. Warden OWEN of Menzies then advised the Department the place was known as "Davyhurst", and this was the name used when the townsite was gazetted in 1901.³ It was named after "Watty" DAVYS.⁴

By September 1915 the adult population was down to thirty males and eighteen females.⁵

POLICE & COURTS = The Police station was operating by March 1902.⁶ A Police building appears to have been erected on

Siberia Street ⁷ in 1906. The station was closed in October 1915.

DAY DAWN - Originally named - BUNDAWADRA.

LOCATION = Latitude 27° 28 south by Longitude 117° 52 east. In the Murchison Goldfields, 6.6 kilometres from the present town of Cue. ¹³

INDUSTRY - Gold mining.

HISTORY = Gold was discovered here by Ted HEFFERMAN in 1892, and he named his discovery "Day Dawn", after the time of day that he pegged his claim. Day Dawn was originally gazetted as Bundawadra in 1894, but was changed to Day Dawn within three months. The area developed rapidly from 1898 when the famous Great Fingall mine was established.

Flooding and other problems closed the Great Fingall mine around the time of the Second World War, and the town of DAY DAWN soon faded away.1

UTILITIES = Hugh OLDHAM is listed as the engineer at the Water Supply in the 1898 postal directory. ¹⁵

LOCATION = Latitude 20° 26' south by Longitude 117° 5' east.

INDUSTRY = Turtle shell. Slave trade

HISTORY = There are descriptions of a turtle shell industry conducted on Barrow and Delambre islands in 1871/72.²¹⁵ This business appears to have been operated in conjunction with the pearling industry. In the early 1870's Captain CADELL established a slave market for both male and female Aboriginal people on Barrow, Delambre and Enderby Islands.²¹⁶

DELANEY'S REEF - Original name for - CARLAMINDA.

DELLERTON RAILWAY SIDING

LOCATION = Latitude 33° 53.5' south by Longitude 115° 41.5' east at the 173 mile 11 chain mark of the Government railway line between Wonnerup and Nannup. ²¹⁷

HISTORY = This was a private siding for the Sussex Timber Company mill opened in June 1924 and named after D. Ellerton BROWN, a director of Millars Timber & Trading Company. The lease of the siding was cancelled in October 1944 and the points and additional rails were removed in January 1945.²¹⁸

DESDAMONIA - A spelling version of - DESDAMONA.

LOCATION = Between the present towns of Menzies and Leonora.²¹⁹

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

Although start up dates from different sources supply the years of 1907, 1908 and 1909 the only final year of operations recorded appears to be 1915. The schools name is also recorded as either the Desmond School or the Elverdton School. The name of the mine was and is the Elverdton Copper Mine, but the surveyed town site is Desmond and the school was on the town site. ²³¹

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The railway siding on the Hopetoun to Ravensthorpe rail line was opened in 1909.²³³ OTHER BUSINESSES

BLACKSMITH =T. S. NICHOLAS is listed in the 1920 postal directory. ²³⁴ **STOREKEEPER** = Francis J. DAW is listed in the 1920 postal directory. ²³⁵

DIORITE KING - An early name for - KURRAJONG.

DONNELLY RIVER TIMBER MILL - YORNUP AREA

LOCATION = Latitude 34° 6.1' south by Longitude 115° 58.6' east. ²³⁶

INDUSTRY = Timber.

HISTORY = Bunnings began construction of this mill and also presumably the nineteen kilometres of company railway line back to Yornup in April 1948. Going into production in January 1949. Logs were originally railed in from lines east of the mill, but this changed to road transport in the early 1950's. The rail line to Yornup remained in use until the last steam locomotive was retired in March 1970. The mill itself closed in 1978 and found use as a holiday camp.²³⁷

DORE ISLAND

LOCATION =

HEALTH = There was a Hospital there by about 1909.²³⁸

DOYLES WELL - Originally called - CUTMORE'S WELL. 239

LOCATION = Between Leonora and Agnew at the confluence of the Turkey and Wilson Creeks. ²⁴⁰

INDUSTRY = Wayside in and coaching stop.

TRANSPORT SERVICES = In 1903 there was a coach service from Leonora three days a week. ²⁴¹ There were stockmen working for the stagecoach lines stationed there until at least about 1912. ²⁴²

HISTORY = The first reports of gold in the area were made in January 1893 by E. BOWDEN and L. SULLIVAN,²⁴³ but the well was probably dug as a water supply for William CUTMORE, Jack DOYLE and John LEYLAND who were in the district prospecting for gold in what was known as the Diorite area in late 1894. By 1895 the name Doyles well seems to have won out and in December 1896 the 5,000 acre reserve 3741 for travellers and stock was created around the well to serve the traffic to the gold fields to the north. In December 1912 Jack DOYLE perished from thirst within thirteen kilometres of Doyles Well.²⁴⁴

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION = A place for rest an recreation was set up, but the date of establishment is not certain. Certainly in July 1896 Richard LEVINGE applied for a Wayside Inn license, but this may not have been granted. The earliest known successful licence was for 1898 in the name of John HOLEHAN trading as the Doyles Well hotel. ²⁴⁵ The 1920 postal directory lists Fred STAUNTON there. ²⁴⁶

The business continued trading under several managers until about 1944/45 when the licence was suspended. The license was re-issued in 1947 and the business continued to trade until it was surrendered in 1950. At one time DOYLES WELL was apparently the source of supply for several illicit inns in the settlements to it's north. The configuration of the original buildings is not certain, but by about the early 1900's there was thought to have been a bar, six bedrooms, a sitting room, a dining room and a kitchen. The building was in a parlous state by about 1937 and the manager Angelo POLETTI had it pulled it down and erected a mud brick structure with a bar, four bedrooms a dining room, plus the managers rooms. Under his stewardship which lasted until about 1943 there was a swimming pool, electric lighting plant, skating rink, four tennis courts, a bowling alley and a large bough shed added. There was also a big sports oval alongside and two large windmills for the water supply. 248

DUKETON

LOCATION = North of the present town of Laverton.

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION

GOLDEN SPINIFEX HOTEL = The 1905 postal directory lists Alfred J. TAYLOR there. ²⁴⁹

OTHER BUSINESSES

BAKER = William HORSBACH is listed in the 1905 postal directory. ²⁵⁰

BANK - BANK OF AUSTRALASIA = George C. R. FARQUHARSON is listed as the manager of the Bank in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵¹

BANK - WESTERN AUSTRALIA BANK = Walter M. HEARN is listed as the manager of the Bank in the 1905 postal directory. 252

BUTCHER = Cox & Co are listed in the 1905 postal directory.²⁵³

NEWS & COMMISSION AGENT = John J. GALLAGHER is listed in the 1905 postal directory. 254

ORE BATTERY = By 1905 the postal directory is listing a Government battery.²¹

RESTAURANT 1 = Miss Matilda ESCREET is listed as operating a restaurant at the Mulga Queen in the 1905 postal directory. 256

RESTAURANT 2 = Robert GOLDEN is listed as operating what is presumably a second restaurant in the 1905 postal directory. ²⁵⁷

STOREKEEPER 1 = The 1905 postal directory lists Walter RITCHIE as a storekeeper. 258

STOREKEEPER 2 = John FOX of Fox & Field is listed with the store actually being managed by James CUNNINGHAM in the 1905 postal directory. ²⁵⁹

DUNCAN'S TIMBER MILL - DWELLINGUP AREA

LOCATION = About twenty kilometres east north east of Dwellingup on one of the many company railway lines which formerly ran out from the Holyoake Timber Mill. ²⁶⁰

DUNDAS

LOCATION = In the Dundas Shire about twenty one kilometres south of the present town of Norseman. Latitude 32° 23' south by Longitude 121° 46' east. 261

INDUSTRY = Gold mining.

HISTORY = In September 1892 gold was discovered in the Dundas hills and reported to the police at Esperence, leading to the Dundas Goldfield being declared in August 1893.²⁶² The town was gazetted in 1895, and derives its name from its situation at the

southern end of the Dundas Hills named by Surveyor General John Septimus ROE in 1848 after Captain DUNDAS of the Royal Navy ship H.M.S. Tagus. 263

UTILITIES = A number of Government water condensers managed by George SLANE, STEWART, BALLOCH, McINTYRE and HORESMAN are listed in the 1897 postal directory. Only one entry for KESSELL managing a Government condenser is listed in the 1898 directory.

CONDENSORS [PRIVATE]

CONDENSER 1 = Thomas and JOHN EATT of Eatt Bros are listed in the 1897 postal directory. 266

CONDENSOR 2 = W. FLEMING and Patrick MURPHY of Fleming & Murphy are listed in the 1897 postal directory. 267

CONDENSOR 2 = W. I ELIMING and I attick MORE IT of Flerining & Multiply are listed in the 1897 postal directory.

CONDENSOR 3 = Henry GLASSFORD and Peter RAFFERTY of Glassford & Rafferty are listed in the 1897 postal directory.

PRAFFERTY is also mentioned in the 1898 directory.

CONDENSOR 4 = Thomas WHITEHEAD is listed in the 1897 postal directory.

POLICE & COURTS = The Police Station was opened in January 1895.²⁷¹ A tender for the police quarters and stables was advertised in 1896.²⁷² The station closed in February 1898.²⁷³

POLICE OFFICERS

COMRIE, John Holthouse [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.196] = From Esperance in April 1897 the to Kalgoorlie in February 1898 274 when the station closed. 27

LAPPIN, William [Corporal/ No.39] = From Albany ²⁷⁶ to take over as Officer in Charge in September 1895.²⁷⁷ Transferred to Norseman in July 1896.

MURPHY, Patrick [Constable/ 3rd class/ Pre-numbered] = Although he is recorded as transferring from Albany in November 1894 he doesn't seem to have taken up duties as the original Officer in Charge until January 1895. He resigned in November 1895, but this may have been as a result of an inquiry in September. ²⁸²

O'HALLORAN, Patrick [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.98] = From Albany in November 1894 then to Niagara in April 1899. 283 This would appear to be well after the Dundas station closed.

TEAHAN, John Patrick [Constable/ 2nd class/ No.113] = From Albany in December 1895 then to Norseman in July 1897.²⁸⁴ **TRANSPORT SERVICES** = The 1897 ²⁸⁵ and 1898 postal directories list a coach service from Coolgardie.²⁸⁶

CARPENTER 1 = George BRAND is listed in the 1897 postal directory. ³⁰⁰ **CARPENTER 1** = Sydney WOODS is listed in the 1897 postal directory. ³⁰¹

ORE BATTERY = H. TUNNINGTON managing what is assumed to be a public battery is listed in the 1898 postal directory. 302

STOREKEEPER 1 = John Robert DUNN, James DUNN and Henry GRIFFITHS of Dunn Bros & Griffiths are listed in the 1897 postal directory. 303

STOREKEEPER 2 = Alf DUNSTONE is listed in the 1897 postal directory. 304

STOREKEEPER 3 = W. S. MATTINSON is listed in the 1897 postal directory. 305

STOREKEEPER 4 - Luigi and V. GATTI and G. ZACALI of Gatti & Co are listed in the 1898 postal directory. 306

STOREKEEPER 4 - Thomas HIBBET is listed in the 1898 postal directory.

STOREKEEPER 5 - Thomas WHITEHEAD is listed in the 1898 postal directory. 308

WOODCUTTER 1 = J. MOONEY is listed in the 1898 postal directory.

HISTORY = The town was named after John DUNNE, a prospector who discovered gold in this vicinity in August 1894. DUNNE's lease later became the Wealth of Nations Mine. 316

The site was declared a townsite in 1897. 31

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The 1898 postal directory lists a coach from Coolgardie. 318

DUNNSVILLE HOTEL = William A. SAYER is listed there in the 1898 postal directory. ³¹⁹

DYKES TIMBER MILL - This timber mill appears to have been in the close vicinity of Gidgegannup and is assumed to have been within the boundaries of the existing township.
