# **I.O.U.** - The original name for - BULONG.

IVES FIND - The original name of - ST IVES.

### THE ISLAND LAKE AUSTIN - An extended version of - LAKE AUSTIN.

## **JACKSON** - Also Known as - MOUNT JACKSON.

**LOCATION** = Latitude 30° 12' south by Longitude 119° 07' east. About one hundred and fifteen kilometres north north east of the present town of Southern Cross. 1

HISTORY = The town was gazetted in 1897, following a request for residential land there in 1896. Although it was locally known as Mount Jackson, Jackson derived its name from the nearby hill named by the explorer Ernest GILES in 1875.

The town was abandoned by 1917. Like many goldfields towns it was very temporary, quickly being occupied with buildings of hessian, wood and iron, and just as quickly abandoned.<sup>2</sup>

# **JARRAHDENE TIMBER MILL - KARRIDALE AREA**

**LOCATION** = About fourteen kilometres north of Karridale.

**INDUSTRY** = Timber.

**HISTORY** = This timber mill was opened in April 1899 by M. C. Davies Karri and Jarrah Company Ltd. <sup>4</sup> In 1902 the company merged with others to form the Millars Combine. The mill closed in 1913. <sup>5</sup>

### **JITARNING**

**LOCATION** = Latitude 32° 47.2' south by Longitude 118° 0.1' east. <sup>6</sup> On the Williams to Kulin Railway line, near the junction of the Williams-Kulin Road and the Jitarring South Road.

HISTORY = The name of the town was taken from the nearby Jitarning Soak in 1917.

TRANSPORT SERVICES = The railway siding was opened in 1915.

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION - There was a sly grog shop operating there from 1914.9

## **JOKER** - Another name for - BILBERATHA.

#### **JONESVILLE**

**LOCATION** = Approximately 90 km north of SANDSTONE.

**HOTELS & ACCOMMODATION** - There was a boarding house.

**INDUSTRY** = Mining. There were between 50 and 100 men working there at any one time during the life of the two mines, Swan Bitter and North End.
